<u>Hive Registration</u> - WV beekeepers are required to register their hives with the WV Department of Agriculture within 10 days of the date that they are acquired. WV Code 19-13-4 states that "All apiary certificates of registration expire on June 30 of each year and must be renewed annually." Just go to <u>wvbeekeepers.org</u> and then click on documents. Then go down to the section that reads WV Immunity Law and Honeybee Best Practices and click on the shield below that to find the Immunity Law and Best Practices.

West Virginia was the first state to pass the Limits of Liability Law if beekeepers sign a voluntary agreement to follow the WVDA Best Management Practices.

"Telling the Bees" – Obituaries - Submitted by Tom and Aretha Kees

**Julia Ann Billie**, 72, passed away July 18, 2020. "Julie" was a major support to her beekeeper husband, Michael, Jr., who took the MCBA Beginning Beekeeping Course in 1997. She sometimes attended meetings with him. A devout Catholic, she taught Sunday School for several years at St. Patrick Catholic Church. She served as director of Religious Education at St. Patrick's and at St. Anthony's.

**William Franklin Kyer**, 74, passed away September 2, 2020. Frank took the MCBA Beginning Beekeeping Course in 1997. Frank was very outgoing and enjoyed talking bees with his beekeeping friends. He was the owner and operator of The Preferred Benefits of West Virginia Insurance Company.

**Karel Polanka**, 89, passed away December 14, 2020. In 1968, Karel and his beloved wife Marta came from communist-controlled Czechoslovakia to our country where they made their home in WV. They became naturalized citizens in 1975. Karel found work as a machinist at Bradshaw Industries in Fairmont and later at Swanson's.

Having first kept honeybees in Czechoslovakia, he and Marta continued their love of beekeeping here. Seventeen hives was the most that they had at any time. At one point they regularly attended meetings held by the Marion County Beekeepers Association, Monongalia County Beekeepers Association and WVBA. In 2012 they were given the WV Beekeeper of the Year award. Although remaining depressed after Marta's death in April 2017, he continued to care for his bees.

Ann Harman, 89, passed away May 1, 2020. Ann was a featured speaker twice at WVBA Fall Conferences as well as once for Marion County Beekeepers Association. Ann grew up in the Washington, DC area, and began work as a research chemist. Later teaching science, she became interested in beekeeping and became one of the first Eastern Apiculture Society (EAS) certified master beekeepers in 1981. She had fifty-some hives for honey production. Ann wrote a column for *Bee Culture* for 40 years, volunteered teaching beekeeping in 29 countries and was a dedicated Honey show judge. She was an officer in local, state, and national beekeeping organizations. Ann was an encyclopedic source of information, never too busy to help any beekeeper with a question.

In 1971, Dayton Michael and Otis Shaver organized the Marion County Beekeepers Association. Dayton was the WVU Extension agent at that time in Marion County. Otis Shaver was an enthusiastic new beekeeper who recognized the benefit of forming a group with a common interest. Only two years before, in 1969, the West Virginia Beekeepers Association was reorganized. Originally chartered in 1917, the state group was revived in 1969 with the help of then State Bee Inspector Earl Cochran. With this, we are one of the oldest local beekeeping groups in the state, and maybe the oldest.

Unfortunately, we cannot at this time plan any kind of celebration. Perhaps if we are able to have our Fall Harvest Dinner, we can cover some of the memories of events over the years.
